A Message from Our President

hange is inevitable. Change can be delightful as we embark on a new adventure. Change can be stressful when it is a response to economic challenges. Modification is one definition of change. Changes are taking place at CKI. The Board of Directors has made severe cuts to the budget in response to reduced income from dues and donations. Employment difficulties have not eluded our membership. Some changes were made to assure accountability. Prior approval for all purchases has resulted in savings in office and maintenance supplies. Contracts were rebid resulting in reduced costs for services. During the coming year email will be substituted for the U.S. mail whenever and wherever possible.

Changes are being implemented to build our membership. People who have never attended High Holiday services at CKI before will receive High Holiday tickets free of charge.

A committee is being formed to develop a multilevel dues structure. Members are encouraged to pay full dues or to voluntarily increase their dues. With a modified dues structure, other members will be spared the embarrassment of requesting a dues variance. Above all, young families will have time to adjust to the mitzvah of contributing to

our community at a higher level.

The Jewish people have survived due to our ability to come together to adapt to various challenges. We fought for the right to pray to one G-d and to study Torah. Let us change, adapt, and grow together.

From the Rabbi's Study...

As the High Holidays approach, I present you with a policy that can make your life better in the New Year.

Perhaps your life would be better if you could exert greater control over other people. We can do that.

Let's start by asking, if you had the power to control others, what would you do with it?

Well, you'd try to make them better people. You'd make their actions more loving, their concerns more benevolent, their words more kind, and their company more pleasant. And while you're at it, you'd straighten out their motivations and get rid of the bad ones.

You can do that. You can improve all the people you encounter in the New Year. Here's how:

Think better of them.

I don't mean that you should fool yourself, and accept things that you know aren't true, but there is great harm and no great benefit in thinking badly of others. And, face it, you don't know. But give people the benefit of the doubt, and it changes the world that you live in. No longer is anyone badly motivated. People treat each other better now in your world. They are more lovable when you see them with loving eyes. You are surrounded by better people.

They may still disagree with you, but now it's no longer because they are nasty and disagreeable. They may simply believe the points that they make. Or they may be threatened by some point that you make, and need reassurance. Or they may be relying on experiences

different from yours. Or they may have legitimate needs that are different from yours. Or they may have had a bad day. Or you may have

A great lesson about controlling one's world came to me from a *mohel* that I knew long ago. He and I were conversing in someone's home before a *bris*, when a man came up to us and said, "Hey, do you want to hear a sick joke?"

The *mohel* didn't miss a beat. He answered smoothly, "No, but thanks." I had never heard anyone say that before. And I am convinced that this *mohel* lived in a better world than I did. In the world that he lived in, the sense of humor was healthy.

I remember hearing about some comedians who performed for an audience of observant Jews. Some knew their audience and some didn't, so that in the end one unfortunate comedian said onstage, "I thought that was a great joke, and nobody laughed."

The comedians who failed were the ones who played with personalities. Those who succeeded played with logic. Of course, they didn't use profanity. But also, they didn't cut anyone down. And beyond that, they didn't complain about their lives. Their jokes were funny and healthy, and people laughed.

As my kids were growing up, I usually played any music they liked if it was decent. But there was one song that I would not allow, and I always turned it off. It was called, "Because of You," and it was a complaint about how the problems in the character's life were caused by someone else.

I feel bad for people who live that way. Myself, I don't have to live in a world where other people cause my problems. And I don't.

Neither, for that matter, did the ancient rabbis, who wrote into the *Musaf* prayer, "For our sins were we exiled from our land." They chose to live in a world where our problems were caused not by the Babylonians or by the Romans, but by us. It's the ultimate power over others

We can learn this power in part by analyzing the following poem by Mary Youngquist:

> That deep red rose I see; Its thorn I just ignore. The scent that's borne to me— It's nothing I deplore!

Those scratches that I got— Before I just complain About the pain a lot, I think of beauty's gain.

Forget about analyzing it. Let's just recite it in a different voice:

That deep red rose—I see its thorn. I just ignore the scent that's borne. To me it's nothing. I deplore Those scratches that I got before. I just complain about the pain. A lot I think of beauty's gain!

Two ways to control a rose. One makes it better, the other worse.

We have the same control over others.

HIGH HOLY DAY YOUTH SERVICES

All youth services begin at **10:30 am** on the **first day only** of *Rosh Hashanah*, Thursday, September 9, and on *Yom Kippur*, Saturday, September 18.

Services for pre-schoolers & kindergarteners (accompanied by an adult) are in the 1st grade room, services for children in 1st–3rd are in the kindergarten room, and services for 4th–7th grades are in the synagogue library.

Babysitting will NOT be available this year.

Services in the main sanctuary are designed for adults. If you bring small children with you, we ask your cooperation in seeing that they do not become a distraction for those around you.

A "Chill-out" room will be available for small children and their parents who need to take a break from services. Appropriate toys and books will be available.

CKI HIGH HOLIDAY TICKET POLICY 5771 / 2010

Because of the special demands created by the numbers of persons wishing to attend services for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, it is necessary to continue the policy of "admission by ticket only" for services.

Tickets are mailed shortly before the Holidays. Only those members who have paid all dues and fees owed will receive tickets.

Tickets are marked and perforated for each service. Security officers/ushers will collect them.

Tickets are required for each member of the family. No tickets are required for the *Yizkor* service on *Yom Kippur*.

No member is turned away because of financial need. If there are financial circumstances that prevent payment of dues, please contact the president, Barb Maring, to make special arrangements.

People who have never attended High Holiday services at CKI before will receive High Holiday tickets *free* of charge.

Members may bring guests who do not live in the immediate area at \$150 per person. Children of members who are not legal dependents and do not live in the area are considered guests.

Married children of family members are considered a family unit unto themselves.

Non-members who live in the Elginland area may purchase tickets for \$700 per family or \$250 per individual.

Arrangements may be made to apply the ticket cost to membership dues.

RULES OF DECORUM

PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA WHILE ON SYNAGOGUE PREMISES. ALL WHO ARE PARTICIPATING WILL GREATLY APPRECIATE YOUR COOPERATION.

Men are required to wear headcoverings; women are requested to wear headcoverings. However, everyone is required to wear headcoverings on the bimah.

Appropriate attire is requested during all services.

Smoking is prohibited on synagogue premises. This includes the parking lot.

No food, drink, or gum chewing is permitted in the sanctuary.

Please respect those who are davening/praying by minimizing conversation.

Cameras and other electronic devices should not be brought into or used on the premises on *Shabbat* or *Yom Tov*.

No cellular phones are to be brought into the sanctuary during services.

Pagers, if necessary, are to be placed on vibrate (non-audio) mode.

Entry into the sanctuary will be limited during certain portions of the service, such as during Ark openings, *Kedushah*, *Hineni*, Rabbi's sermon, and officers' speeches.

Services in the main sanctuary are designed for adults. Consider child care at home. But if you must bring small children with you, we ask your cooperation in seeing that they do not become a distraction for those around you.

KEVER AVOT SERVICE

The annual *Kever Avot* Memorial Service will be held at the **CKI Section of Elgin's Bluff City Cemetery** at **1:00 pm**on **Sunday, September 12**. Entrance to the cemetery should be through the east gate. Please let the guides know you are there for the CKI service, and you will be able to drive to CKI's section.

Kever Avot is the customary visit to graves of loved ones during the month of Elul. The service is brief and allows family and friends to say memorial prayers for those who are no longer with us. It is also customary for anyone to visit the CKI section even though their family or friends rest in another part of the country. This is a way to remember.

TASHLIKH

It is customary to walk to a body of water to perform *Tashlikh* during the High Holidays. This ritual demonstrates the separation of sin from our lives. Into the water we symbolically cast our sins of the year gone by, and we reaffirm our intention that life in the new year be renewed by a new heart and a new spirit. To celebrate this ritual, we are gathering on Walton Island, at the Fox **River** in downtown Elgin, immediately following Rosh Hashanah services on Thursday, September 9. Bridges access the island immediately to the west of the Hemmens Auditorium. You are encouraged to bring a dairy or vegetarian picnic lunch.

HANDY HOLIDAY TIPS READING AIDS

Special booklets containing congregational selections have been prepared in transliteration. These are available to those who do not read Hebrew fluently to supplement the *Machzor*. The booklet allows everyone to join in the traditional congregational prayers. Ask your ushers for a copy. In addition, there are a limited number of large-print copies of the *Machzor* available. You may also obtain these from the ushers.

PLEASE BE ON TIME

If you have been assigned an honor, please be in the sanctuary at least 15 minutes earlier than the estimated time.

HANG ONTO YOUR BOOK

When ascending the *bimah* for your honor, please take your *Machzor* with you so that you may follow the service. All persons are required to wear headcoverings on the *bimah*.

TALLIT

It is not customary to wear a *tallit* for the *Erev Rosh Hashanah* service on Wednesday evening, Sept. 8. Please remember to bring your own *tallit* for the balance of the High Holiday services. Women are encouraged to wear a *tallit* if they so desire.

YOM KIPPUR FASHION TIP

The proper footwear is anything but leather soles for *Yom Kippur*. Leather-bodied shoes with plastic/rubber soles are acceptable, as are leather belts.

Wearing white is quite acceptable for Yom Kippur. It reminds us of the purity we seek to attain, of the angels we are a little less than in Creation, and of our deceased loved ones who are buried in simple white linen garments.
