From the Rabbi's Study...

My husband and I have a mixed marriage. Surprised? What do I mean? We were both born Jewish, so that's not it. Nor is it that I lived in Evanston and he was raised in Hyde Park. No, the big difference is he loves the serious Jewish holidays, Passover and Yom Kippur, in particular, and I am drawn to the ones that teach us joy—Simchat Torah and Purim.

Be happy it's Adar. That is what we are taught to say this month. What does Adar celebrate? Survival. We survived the winter. We survived Haman. We are still here. We celebrate Esther, an orphan girl who rose to be queen and saved her people. The stuff of fairy tales. Disney could make a movie. All too often, Purim, the holiday at the middle of the month, is a chaotic, child-centered, loud event—lots of noise as we drown out Haman's name, some running around the synagogue, costumes, carnival games, Purim spiels and plays, Hamantaschen. It's fun! And it is OK to have fun, to be happy, to be silly, to laugh, to celebrate, to relax just a little.

But Purim is more than just about kid-centered fun. Queen Esther was a shy heroine at first who found her voice and spoke up. There is a charming book, *What Queen Esther Knew: Business Strategies from a Biblical Sage* by Connie Glaser and Barbara Smalley. It appeals to me both with my business kippah and my rabbi kippah. What did Queen Esther know? Plenty! This book has practical tips based on the Esther story that will make the life of a businesswoman or a woman rabbi that much easier. Starting with just the first chapter when they talk about making a royal first impression and the idea that you have four minutes in a first encounter to make a lasting impression. Oh sure, the story of Esther may be about beauty being skin deep, but she prepared for that first encounter for months. She relied on Hegai to give her insider information about the protocols of the palace—good strategy. There is a description of a medical board review meeting. The chief of radiology was told,

"Never surprise anyone at a meeting. Never bring up anything that hasn't been discussed before the meeting. If you are going to make a motion or build on an agenda item, you must discuss it with all the other pertinent parties before the meeting." Wise words. Applies both to the business world and synagogue boards.

After finding a mentor and figuring out how to use palace gossip to her advantage, Queen Esther fights for what she believes in. She finds the power of her voice. After telling Mordechai she was scared to speak up because it could mean her death, Mordechai exhorts her, "Do not think that because you are in the king's house, you alone will be spared...For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance...will arise from another place...And who knows, perhaps you are in this (royal) position for such a time as this." That last phrase is a very powerful statement. After providing many examples of modern day Queen Esthers in the business world, the book urges us, "Go ahead—take at least a tiny risk you have a strong gut feeling about, and don't agonize over it—even for a second. Women in positions of power do this all the time and say it's the quickest way to get comfortable taking risks.

This is something to be happy about, something to celebrate. Be happy, it's Adar! How will you use your voice today? What will you speak up about? What risk can you take to save the Jewish people or make the world a better place? How will you be like Esther?

There is much to be joyful about at CKI this month:

We start by celebrating Black History Month on February 1 as part of our regular Kabbalat

Shabbat service. The Second Baptist Church choir and their pastor, Rev. Nathaniel Edmonds, will be joining us for our second instrumental music Shabbat. They were here for the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service and they are coming back. I expect the music will rock the house as our voices are lifted in praise. The discussion will be a continuation of what we began Martin Luther King Junior Weekend. What do our communities have in common and how can we best work together in our growing partnership?

February 2 we will have a PJ Shabbat Havdalah service. Open to the entire school community, (and others who wish to celebrate), we will begin with Havdalah, then have dinner, stories, crafts and a chance to marvel at the beauty of the stars and the planets. Dan Rich will bring his telescopes. Social Action – Tikkun Olam

Tikkun Olam...Why? Because being Jewish is not a passive verb. It's the Action in Social Action.

Nor is 'being Jewish' only about writing a check. Here are several Social Action mitzvahs we can perform without writing a check:

Public Action to Deliver Shelter (PADS)

Volunteering for PADS is an easy mitzvah. PADS, the homeless shelter of Elgin provides safe shelter, support services and advocacy to homeless individuals in Dundee, Elgin and Hanover Townships. Four CKI volunteers are needed to assist them on the second Monday of every month from 6:30-8:30pm. Duties involve checking in the evening's guests who need shelter for the night, as well as general light duties such as handing out bedding, folding laundry, and interfacing with the guests in a supportive manner. Prior to volunteering you do need to attend one training session. Volunteers also contribute a gallon of milk, a carton of juice and a box of cereal. Please contact Gareth Sitz to volunteer.

Food for Greater Elgin

CKI has started volunteering one day per month at Food for Greater Elgin. FGE does not bundle food for their clients. Instead, clients are permitted to "shop" and select items which mesh with their family's diets, while maintaining their dignity. Volunteer duties vary; if you have keyboarding skills you can input data for them or you can work in the "store." Contact Nancy Zimmerman if you can volunteer.

DefEATING Hunger

Even if you were unavailable to attend our first ever CKI Community Garden planning session, you can still be part of DefEATING Hunger in our Elgin community. We at CKI will soon be planting our spring garden. The DefEATING Hunger concept is unique in that 100% of the harvest that we grow is dedicated for donation to Food for Greater Elgin. It is so very important that we have a successful season as there are some 19,000 food insecure individuals in the Elgin area. Making that statistic more dismal is that so many of these persons are children. But we can and shall make a difference. Please help.

CKI is also taking a leadership position by educating various churches and service organizations of the hunger issue in our community. We have put together a network of resources and persons with expertise who will mentor other groups and help them organize community gardens of their own. If you are able to network and make the initial contact within any group or organization (in Greater Elgin), Sherry Wiesman will act as facilitator connecting groups, volunteers and resources so that in 2013 there will be many Community Gardens with harvests for Food for Greater Elgin.

Hunger is a community wide problem and it is going to take the actions of the community to resolve it.
