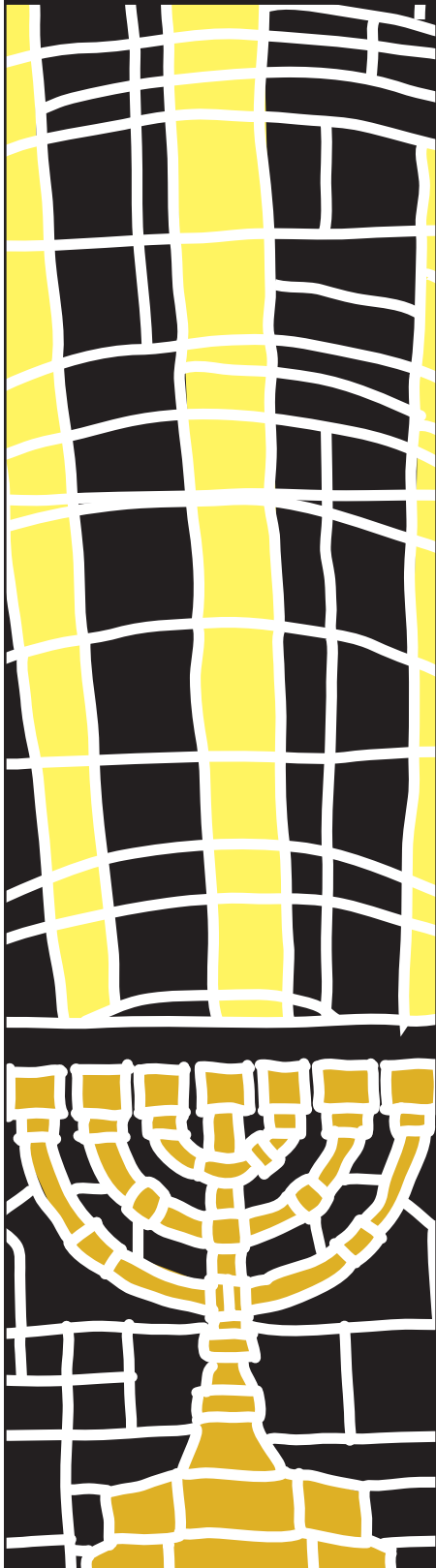

NO SHORTAGE OF SHORTENED SHABBATS SEEN THIS SUMMER

No, the above is not a tongue twister. It is a statement of what you can expect at *Shabbat* services here at CKI later this spring and summer. Owing to the popular reception of the practice this past fall and winter, CKI will offer "Shortened *Shabbat*" services on a more regular basis, so that attendees can enjoy a traditional service while still being able to take advantage of the better weather.

A "Shortened *Shabbat*" service begins at the regular 9:30 a.m. time but at a later part in the *siddur*: at page 105, with the "*Shochein Ad*" prayer. From that point, the service proceeds purposefully, but not without what you'd expect from the "normal" *Shabbat* morning service, including the *Torah* reading, the

Haftarah, and remarks from Rabbi Kohn, with a finish of the service by 11:00.

From the Rabbi's Study...

The Law of Unanimity

I often say that Judaism is counterculture. But it's not just me.

The earliest rabbis (whom we refer to in Hebrew as *Chazal*, a word whose letters stand for "Sages of Blessed Memory") demanded that we be counterculture. In fact, they wrote a law to make sure of it.

The law is an obscure one, and no longer in force. It worked when civil and criminal matters were decided by rabbinical courts, long before the appearance of the modern nation state.

The law referred, I believe, only to capital cases, but perhaps not. The law said this: that if all the judges in a case agree that a defendant is guilty, then he is acquitted.

Now, I understand that there is a difference between being counterculture and being crazy. But this law is not crazy. It is eminently sane. Let's take a closer look.

The Jewish system of law lacks several features of American law. For one, it has no legislature. Jewish laws are amended through a judiciary, which is the rabbinate.

In a sense, the rabbinate is all the legal system that we have. We have a constitution, which is the written *Torah* and its oral traditions, and

then we have the rabbinate to interpret it. Beyond the rabbinate, we have the entire Jewish community, who has the power to decide who will be accepted as a rabbi and who will not.

But the rabbis do not just interpret laws, they also write them. These laws are described in Aramaic as *derabanan*, rabbinical laws, and they are less firmly founded than Scriptural laws (*de'oraita*), but they are still binding on us until the day comes when they are overturned or repealed. Ending *Shabbat* at dark instead of sunset, for instance, is a rabbinical law. So, for that matter, is monogamy, because the *Torah* teaches that our ancestor Jacob had two wives, and beyond that King Solomon had perhaps more than he had time to count. So it was the rabbis (and specifically one *Rabbeinu Gershom* of the early Middle Ages) who restricted the sons of Israel to one wife each.

But rabbis do more than write laws, because our system lacks another feature that we take for granted in America. We don't have a jury. The facts in a case, and the sentence, are all determined by the judges.

Yet another element that we lack—which makes a great deal of difference here—is attorneys. Now, this lack of attorneys is not necessarily as great a blessing as it might first

appear. In the rabbinic system, which was more similar to the Napoleonic Code than to British common law, and therefore worked more like Louisiana courts than those of New England, the witness was examined not by attorneys but by a panel of judges, who were charged not just with interpreting the law but also with determining the facts. Neither plaintiff nor defendant was represented by counsel.

So the problem arose: without representation by counsel, who will make sure that the judges appreciate the defendant's best case? Who will ensure a fair trial?

Perhaps we can say that it will be the judges. After all, they were chosen for their wisdom, learning, and piety. But no, that is not sufficient, because the *Torah* teaches, and all Jewish law accepts, that even the best judge is fallible.

In fact, Jewish law holds that anyone, no matter how honest, who enters into a contract without writing it down is guilty of encouraging deceit. Judges are fallible, and they cannot be trusted entirely to recognize a defendant's interest.

Using their best judgment, then, is not sufficient. Somebody on their panel must also

speak up and articulate the defendant's case. And that is why, if the vote is unanimous to convict, then the defendant is acquitted. When all the judges agree that he is guilty, then we presume that their very unanimity prevented them from prosecuting a fair trial.

Here is counterculture enacted into law. *Chazal* held that when people are all of one mind, then they are especially likely to be wrong. There must always be a voice for the other side. What is absolutely obvious to all is most suspect.

There are scores of examples from modern times. During China's Cultural Revolution, some in their hearts may have supported Mao and others may have opposed him, but everyone agreed that meaning in life derived from politics. In Soviet Russia, whether you were a Communist or not, you understood that all his-

tory derived from class struggle. In Nazi Germany, what was called "scientific" racism was accepted by each party and faction. In early 20th-century America, enlightened people saw the eugenics movement to improve society through judicious breeding as self-evidently good. When everyone agrees, then watch out. Something bad may be about to happen. In such a case, rabbinic judges may not convict. They must acquit.

There are a few things that all rabbis agree on: the unity of God, the authority of *Torah*, and the fellowship of the Jewish people. That's about it. If there is a fourth thing that we all agree on, then we should not accept it until we've heard an opposing point of view.

So are we counterculture? Yes, always, and in every society. *Chazal* didn't just accept that counterculture was good. They wrote it into law.
