D'Var Torah from Sisterhood Shabbat

*EDITOR'S NOTE: This D'var Torah was written and read by **Adele Stein** at our annual Sisterhood Shabbat on January 21. For those that missed that lovely service, and for those that wish to ponder her words in depth, we reprint her words here.*

* * *

Welcome to Sisterhood Shabbat. This week's Torah Portion is about Yitro or Jethro, Moshe's father-in-law. The parsha indicates that Jethro brings Tziporah (Moses's wife) and their two children to the camp of the Hebrews. Evidently, Tziporah was sent home sometime before they left Egypt, to be safe with her father and the Midianites.. Yitro had heard what God had done for Moses and for Israel, his people. Moses went to meet them and explained to Jethro all that had happened in Egypt with Pharaoh. Upon arriving, the two men embrace. But we read of no reunion between Moses and Tziporah. Jethro was very impressed with what he heard and rejoiced over the kindness of the Lord; he was the first one to bless God. He admitted to Moses that God is greater than all. The people would come to Moses for advice and to settle disputes. Jethro couldn't believe that Moses was the only person who was able to give advice and answers to the Jewish people. Jethro knew that this lack of hierarchy was destined for failure. So he advised Moses how

to establish a system whereby the Jews would first go to other knowledgeable people and only seek out Moses for the most complicated and difficult questions and cases. Moses' father-in-law suggested the judicial system which uses capable men who are trustworthy and fear God to help with the judging. This was the beginning of delegation and being open to, listening to, and learning from constructive criticism. Jethro was big on encouraging Moses to listen to God and the people. At this point some consider that Yitro has converted. But after that, Jethro goes back to his own people, to his own land, and his own life.

From the "non-reunion" of Moses and Tziporah through these verses and beyond, women are either forgotten or excluded from the entire narrative. However, the Parsha teaches about leadership and how people can live together in a society with rules. After that episode with Jethro, God gave Moses the 10 commandments (rules) to share with the people. Because it was the defining moment, we are bound to ask, did the Eternal One address everyone – or only the males? Just prior to the Revelation the Eternal One

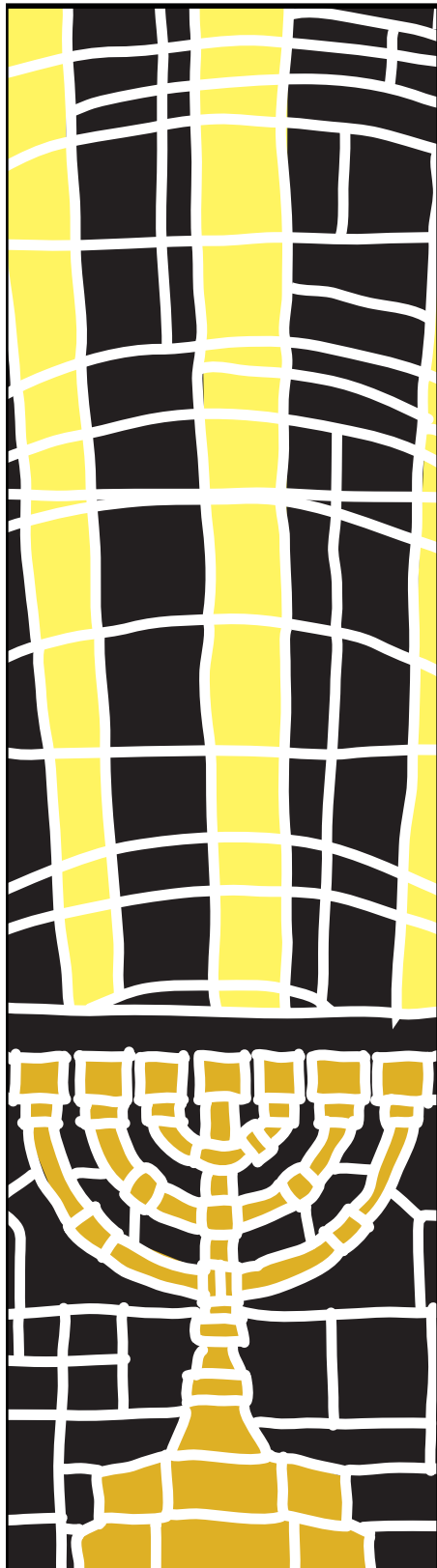

declares to Moses: "Thus shall you say to the house of Jacob and declare to the children of Israel" (Exodus 19:3). Interpreting what looks like repetition, "the house of Jacob" refers to the women "the children of Israel" refers to the men, indicating that both women and men were included. However, the women were addressed first. Why did He command the women first?

1 – Women are obligated in Mitzvot a year before men (age 12 and men age 13).

2 – Hashem wanted to honor the women since they are the ones who teach Torah to the young children at home. Generally, a child's initial education in Torah and Mitzvot are from the mother's influence at home.

3 – Women shouldn't think that if they don't keep Mitzvot properly, it's not as bad as if men don't.

4 – Hashem wanted to honor the women since it was because of them that we were taken out of Mitzrayim.

Whatever the reason, we are certain that the women were included.

We, the women of CKI, are also included. The sisterhood takes on many roles here at the synagogue. It is the sisterhood that makes sure that the kitchen is kosher, provides the paper goods for the kitchen, and makes sure that all food that is provided meets the laws of kashrut. We provide the oneg and kiddush each week, and we make sure that the elderly have food through the Meals on Wheels program. We support our school and youth groups and make sure our children are educated. We are the House of Jacob. Tonight we showed our support for prayer and God, as our women lead the service. And may you all have Shabbat Shalom.

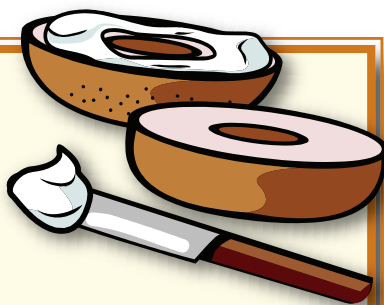

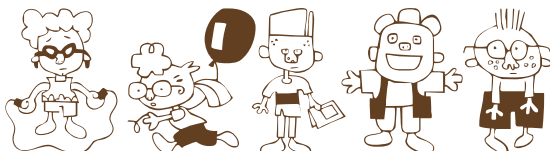

Our guest speaker Agnes is from Budapest, Hungary.

Upon occupation by Nazi forces in 1944, she was forced to move into a ghetto. At age 10, the family maid took Agnes in as her 'niece' who was fleeing from the Russian army. During Allied bombings, Agnes was sent into underground hiding for months. Agnes' father was saved by Raoul Wallenberg and hidden in one of his safe houses. Her grandmother, grandfather and aunt all drowned in the Danube, and her mother was deported to and perished at Bergen Belsen.

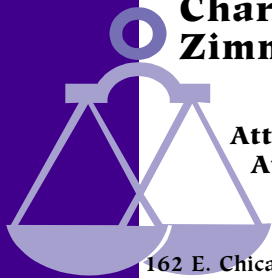

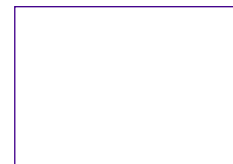
