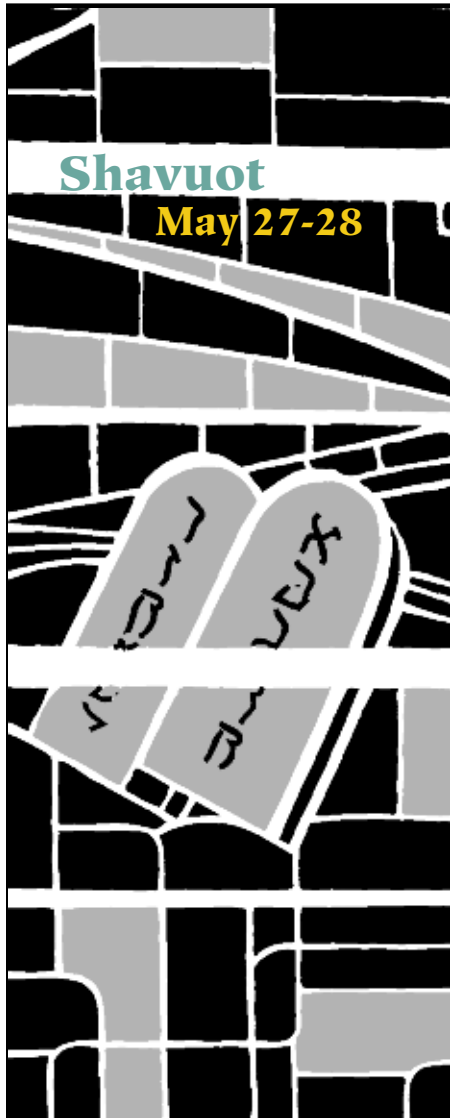

President's Message



BULLY:

A Year In The Life Of America's Bullying Crisis,

rated R, opened April 13, 2012 in theaters across the nation. "Following five kids and families over the course of a school year, the film confronts bullying's most tragic outcomes, including the stories of two families who've lost children to suicide and a mother who waits to learn the fate of her 14-year-old daughter, incarcerated after bringing a gun on her school bus." (Synopsis of movie provided by *Movie Insider*.)

Bullying can happen anywhere, to anyone. It is not just children bullying other children. It could be found in families, work places, recreational facilities, and even in religious organizations. Bullying has gotten out of control.

A child or an adult should feel safe in their homes, schools, churches, and synagogues. It is almost two years since CKI started its Vision process. CKI wanted to become a warmer, friendlier, and more open community—a family where everyone would be treated with respect, compassion and understanding. We welcomed a new concept, Keruv. Keruv is not only welcoming of interfaith and inter-racial families, but also of varying lifestyles and respecting each individual's rights and thoughts.

CKI pledged Lifelong Learning, Building Community, Meaningful Observance and Embracing Diversity to all members of our

congregation. When I became President, I stood behind this Vision, and a year later I still believe in this Vision.

Every member, no matter their age, gender, or religious belief, is welcomed to our community. Each member should know that when they enter our building, they should expect to be treated respectfully. Each member should feel safe.

I wanted to speak about this movie, *Bully*, because, ironically, it was given an R rating. The actual target group this movie was intended for was the PG13 group, but because of the realities of this topic, these young children are not allowed to see a movie about their own peers. How will they learn and understand that to bully a peer is wrong, that sometimes there are severe consequences. The loss of a life of anyone because they are being bullied is a horrible tragedy. Everyone, adult and child, needs to step up and stop this craziness that is affecting our children, and even adults.

I plead with the families of CKI: heed our Vision—especially embracing diversity. Teach our children (and ourselves) to be more compassionate towards each other and help stop this bullying. There are strengths in numbers, and I know we can all step up to fight this war.

■ **Food Pantry Desperate** – Please, open your heart; the food pantry situation at the Crisis Center is desperate. Their needs to provide food for extra persons has never been greater. There is real hunger in the Fox Valley. It's an easy mitzvah to perform. Just bring your non-perishable food, baby formula and diaper donations to CKI. The collection pantry is immediately on your right as you enter CKI through the parking lot entrance. Develop the (good) habit of bringing a big or small donation each time you enter the building (except on Shabbat and Jewish holidays). No time to shop? We can also accept Fundability Cards for grocery stores. (This is a double mitzvah, as CKI makes a small amount on your purchase of the card, and the hungry also benefit). As always, *if you or your family need food from the pantry in order to put food on your table, do not hesitate to help yourself.* No questions asked.

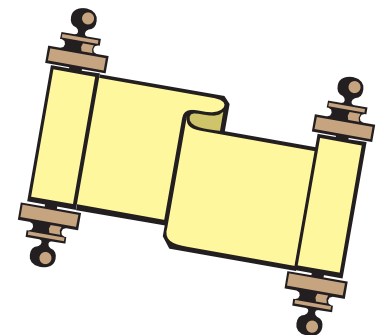

INDOOR CLIMBING WALL WAIVER AND RELEASE AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK
(Parent Form)**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The City of Elgin is committed to conducting its recreation programs and activities in a safe manner and holds the safety of participants in high regard. The City of Elgin continually strives to reduce such risk and insists that all participants follow safety rules and instructions that are designed to protect the participants' safety. However, participants and parents/guardians of minors registering for this program must recognize that there is an inherent risk of injury when choosing to participate in recreational activities.

You are solely responsible for determining if you or your Minor Child/ward are physically fit and/or adequately skilled for the activities contemplated by this agreement. It is always advisable, especially if the participant is pregnant, disabled in any way or recently suffered an illness, injury or impairment, to consult a physician before undertaking any physical activity.

WARNING OF RISK

Climbing walls are intended to challenge and engage the physical, mental and emotional resources of each participant. However, despite careful and proper preparation, instruction, medical advice, conditioning and equipment, there is still a risk of serious injury. Understandably, not all hazards and dangers can be foreseen. The very nature of using climbing walls is hazardous and risky, including, but not limited to, overexertion, slip and falls, loose and/or damaged artificial holds, being fallen on by other users, belay and/or belayers failure, lack of good physical conditioning, inadequate or defective equipment, inadequate instruction or supervision, poor technique, carelessness, horseplay, premises defects, and all other risks inherent to the use of climbing walls. In this regard, it must be recognized that it is impossible for the City of Elgin to guarantee absolute safety.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS AND LIABILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK


